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Our second team of the year included general and GYN surgeons. Dr. Latham, one of our returning anesthesiologists, brought two CRNAs—always exciting to see our surgical family grow. This team of 19 provided 36 life-changing surgeries, and we praise the Lord for the 8 salvation decisions. We're especially grateful for Dr. Hernandez, who has faithfully served with us for three years. As a GYN surgeon, he offers women procedures they've only hoped for. With three donated bladder slings, he performed our first bladder sling surgery, giving one patient the confidence to leave her home again. This trip he invested in a local GYN doctor, teaching bladder sling placement and laparoscopic tubal ligations—another first for the Rearick Clinic.

May was a good time to return to the States to prep our fall Delta Cargo shipment, and handle items that needed to be hand-carried. My first weekend stop was Martinez, GA, for a dear friend's wedding—so grateful for friends who model faithful service and trust in God's timing. On Sunday, I shared an update with Trinity Baptist Ministries, faithful partners for nearly five years. Grateful for the partners God has placed around me.

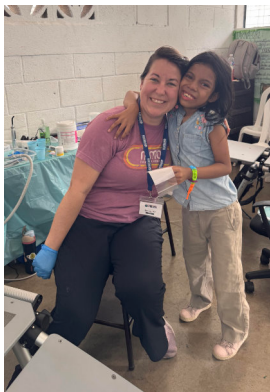
#### Medical Missions Outreach - General Medical Clinics

After one week back home in Honduras, I left for Guatemala. We had two separate teams: one in Retalhuleu, and one in Chimaltenango. I spent the week serving in Retalhuleu with Pastor Robin and Mariela Cifuentes. This week looked very different than most trips. Instead of serving as the team operations coordinator, I stepped in as a dental assistant since the dental team was short-staffed. I loved learning how fillings and extractions work. Practicing my Spanish with patients and hotel staff was another highlight of my week. Our team of 43—medical, dental, optical, and physical therapy—saw a total of 2,300 patients over four clinic days. 678 of those patients made professions of faith. Please be in prayer for the Cifuentes family and their church as they discipline these new Christians, and make further contact with the patients.

#### Summer 2026

Our three summer interns joined me on the trek back to Honduras. We then drove down south to Siguatepeque where we all took Spanish lessons at a ministry school, and the interns were able to volunteer at a local clinic. It was a wonderful experience, and I plan to return to the school in August for more Spanish lessons. Upon our return to El Progreso, the interns assisted me with finishing preparations for the 3rd surgical team's arrival and their departure to join the Santa Rita team. We had an incredible team of 19 come and perform 30 surgical procedures. Three of those team members were medical

## Patient Stories

Juana had a fast-growing lipoma on her temple that caused constant headaches. After surgery, her headaches were gone and she felt confident going outside again.

Another patient had lived with incontinence for over 10 years, too embarrassed to leave home. This year, with donated bladder slings, Dr. Hernandez was able to perform the surgery she needed. At her follow-up, she shared she no longer had incontinence and felt free to go out again.

Imagine having a gallbladder attack, changing your diet, and still dealing with pain, nausea, and vomiting for 4 years. This was the case of our 29yo patient. They were trying to save up money for the surgery, but then she was hospitalized at the beginning of the year for 7 days. This was her chance to receive her much needed surgery. She was prepped for surgery, but before she received it, they canceled it. Thankfully she heard about the Rearick and was able to hear the Gospel and finally receive her much needed surgery.
