DEAR SUPPORTERS:

Can you believe it, another year has arrived! Looking forward to what God will do through me in 2026. To begin this New Year off: the Presidential elections went for the most part, peaceful. President Museveni is still the President of Uganda. I have yet to see the winner and the oppositions shake hands. There are many going to court stating foul play and cheating were involved. Even though there were many observers from countries outside of Uganda and Africa. There were some problems with the voting machines. I was able to look at the whole process each day by TV.

- I am still trying to reschedule meetings from Nov 25. No matter how advance I try to plan, things come up and there is no plan B. I was supposed to meet with the church in Kumi 20 Mar at 1000. They notified me the evening of 19 Mar the meeting must be postponed.

- I thought I would be able to make it to Amuria Prison in Jan, but Ps Martin was sick and it had been a long time since I had visit there. I had not been there since Jul 25. Would they remember me? Was the question. It was too far travel to come back without success. In Feb, the weather was bad and I was not sure of the roads. I told the women in Jul 25 that I would return when roads were repaired. Finally, in Mar, we were able to travel to Amuria Prison. The road were passable. I took the women some soap and biscuits. The guard did remember me! They had all new prisoners (8). They said some went home and some to Soroti Prison. We had a good meeting. Even the guard sat in on the lesson.

- I was not able to speak to the women at Soroti Prison at all

these 3 months. However, I was able to speak to the Officer in Charge (OC) of the women. In Jan because of the election period no visitors were allowed in. In Feb and Mar, the women had many bags of gnuts to shell. I have tried before to speak to them when they were shell and it did not go well, no one was listening. The OC said this is how they get money for the women. She said they get 12,000 a sack which is about 100kg. That's about \$3. Lord willing I will be able to visit in Apr.

- The OC of Soroti helped me obtain the cell number of the OC to Ngora Prison. I am still trying to connect with Mbale and Kaberamaido Prisons, too. I called the OC in Ngora and she told me there were no women there. I had visited the prison a few years ago, but under a different OC. However, she said there will be more and that I could call her each month to check! An answer to prayer to finally talk to the OC of Ngora.
- I have had no problem visiting Kumi and Serere Prisons. I was able to take each prison soap and biscuits in Feb. Once I am able to get into Soroti I will take them soap and biscuits too. During Mar visit to Serere prison I was able to talk with the OC. He is typically not there when I visit. It's a good thing to meet face to face occasionally. Most of the women were new so he introduced himself and me to the women.
- I thank God for two more young women that said they want to help me translate!
- I was able to visit Ngora Deaf School each month. The children are participating much. I am telling Bible stories using posters. I print out two verses each month pertaining to the Bible stories for memory. I review each lesson from the previous month and give out Bible bracelets when they answer my questions correctly. Quite a few students have received them! I spoke on Noah, Zacchaeus, and Jonah. Have you ever seen the Deaf praise the Lord in song?
- St. Pius Vocational School and Director Simon are doing a little better with finances. I was able to visit them in Jan and Feb. I spoke to these

new students in Feb. As usual I passed out tracts and J/Rs.



- I was also able to visit God's Touch Vocational School in Feb. Director Moses still having land issues, but new students arriving. Visitors always pop in during the lessons. Moses is the
