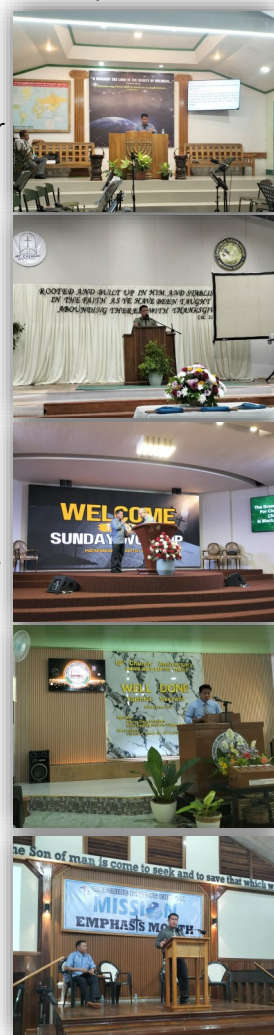
While we are in the Philippines, we seldom report to churches in the Visayas and Mindanao. Many of them I have not visited for the past 12 to 18 years. In the past two months, I decided to visit some churches in the northern and western parts of Mindanao that have never stopped holding the rope for us. We traveled by land, driving from Luzon in my 13-year-old vehicle. I thank God for His traveling mercies in keeping us safe from Luzon to Zamboanga despite some mechanical problems encountered along the way. We also distributed gospel tracts wherever we had opportunities. It was also a blessing to drop by my hometown in Southern Leyte and see my relatives. My wife and I stayed a couple of days in Cagayan de Oro and scheduled visits to churches in nearby towns.

One of the most meaningful moments, especially for my wife, was returning to Dipolog City, where we ministered for three years before launching our first mission field in Sri Lanka. My wife had not been back to that place for about 18 years. During our visit to Westside Baptist Church in Dipolog City, I spoke to the Bible college students and preached in the church during their Missions Emphasis Sunday.

Another exciting trip was our visit to my two brothers in a remote area of Zamboanga, where I had not returned for the past 36 years. Kindly pray for their salvation, especially my elder brother who has been suffering from a stroke and has been partially paralyzed for 11 years. Sometimes, while ministering to people in other countries, we forget to minister to our own bloodline.

Please continue to pray for our journey, as we are still here in Mindanao while writing this letter. Thank you for holding the rope for world missions.
