In my last prayer letter I requested prayer for our Primary Level 7 pupils (P7) since they were preparing for the National Primary Leaving Exam (PLE). This past Monday and Tuesday, they went to the testing center for our area to "sit" for exams. They will not get the results until early next year, but they feel like they did okay on all four exam papers – even math! You will remember that one of the math teachers left at the beginning of term 2, and I was asked to step in. Whew, it was rough, but we made it! Today the four boys (see picture) gave me a sweet and encouraging thank you note. I want to pass on their thanks to you – my partners in ministry.

Dear Mum,

We are writing this letter to thank you for teaching us mathematics and CRE [Bible] and the most important thing marriage counseling us [In Bible, one of the topics is Biblical Principles of Marriage]. We also thank you for all the expenses and time you gave for us. We thank you for buying us books that we could use to teach ourselves. We also thank you for allowing us [to] sit in the hall way reading our books with the mosquito jelly you bought for us [They studied on the veranda at night, so, I got them mosquito repellent.] We are very grateful that when you were asked to teach us you sacrificed all the class and taught us.

I am here in Uganda because you are a partner with me. I got the joy of receiving the sweet note (made me cry), but the thanksgiving is mine to share with you. And all glory to God!

Thank you for praying about my psoriasis. It was getting so bad it was becoming erythrodermic, which is actually life threatening. You may remember that in 2023 it progressed to that stage, and I was very ill. I am on methotrexate, and it has slowed down, but the dermatologist said it would be some weeks before it started actually reducing. Please continue to pray for my health.

Also, the presidential election is in January and campaigns for that and other important offices are (literally) in swing. The American embassy has issued warnings.

African elections always have some violence, but this time around predictions are that, like recent elections in neighboring countries, it could be worse than usual. Please pray for peace.
