DEAR SUPPORTERS:

Thank you for the yearly support you have given to me. 2026 is here and there is still much to do. The fields are still white unto harvest as well as His coming is nigh!

Pray for planning:

I pray then plan; however, in November a few disappointments:

As I was **headed to Soroti my truck (Debra) decided not to work** when she did well during the week and this was Thursday I was travelling. I did not understand. I pulled over, there was power, but it would not move at the right speed. The blessing was I got her to a fuel station not too far away with a lot of parking space. I was not just sitting on the side of the road which would have been very unsafe. Just a few kilometers outside of Mukono. I called all the mechanics I knew plus others some others knew. There was only one mechanic I knew that was able to come and help. I was too far away, for others. I will not let any mechanic touch my truck. I stopped at 1400, and the mechanic made it to me at 1900. He started the repair as soon as he arrived after I explained my problem and it was not an easy fix without a garage at all. I am surprised they even tried to help. The problem was my gear box and he had to drop it and replace the clutch disc, pressure plate, and the clutch release bearing. His helper had to look for the parts before coming to where we were located. No one got any sleep. Those guys worked on my truck until I drove it away at 0930 the next morning headed to Soroti. The mechanic and I tested it many times in the empty parking lot before I hit the main road. It was neat to see their attitudes. They joked and laughed the whole night while repairing my truck. I did not see them eat or drink water. I was a little upset at Debra for I was not in a joking mood. So much work and they did it! PTL! Unfortunately, I missed my appointment at 1000, Friday with the church in Kumi. I made it to Soroti safely.

I texted all concerned about the problem with my truck. Saturday, **the women meeting in Gweri** never took place. The person who helped me planned this never showed and she knew the truck was ready. I still do not know what happened.

The Women Conference in Agago District, the roads to get to the Church were flooded. So we planned it for 12 Dec. By then definitely things would be normal.

I was able to make it to **all the prisons**. I was really looking forward to going to Amuria prison before the year was over. I stopped going in July because the roads were so bad. I told the women once the roads were repaired I would return, not knowing when they would or if be repaired. Someone I know who lives in Amuria told me they had repaired the roads! PTL! I will visit the women this year, I thought.

The Ngora Deaf School: I was able to visit and the children was well behaved this time too. There was great participation. Am still working with the head teacher in trying to make me an appointment to visit the Secondary

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Deaf School in Mbale. It will not happen this year. I thought the students were released for the holidays in Dec, but I found out after my lesson, Wed, from the Head Teacher, they will be released 26 Nov. There was no time to bring them sweets. Other schools in Uganda were being released in Dec. I hope do better in finding out these dates at the beginning of the year, Lord willing.

Continue to pray for more translators to help me.

Now...the beginning of Dec was a bit of a blur for me. The last two weeks of Dec I do not drive because of the holiday season, the roads are more unsafe than any other time. So, I planned my trip to Soroti early in the month. I was supposed to depart 8 Dec. My plans had been made and prayed over everyone acknowledge my coming. I was feeling really bad the week of 1 Dec, but I would get better I thought because I have to go to Soroti. 7 Dec while at church I barely could move, no energy. The Pastor and his wife took me to the hospital later Sunday evening, I didn't want to go, but there is a problem. At the hospital, they tested me for **Malaria** and the test was positive. They wanted to admit me to the hospital. Not, happening I have to go to Soroti tomorrow. I told the doctor. Still feeling lousy. (How can I drive there, let alone stand? Am asking myself.) We got the meds they prescribed. I decided not to go... (How can I drive? Am asking myself, still.) Hospital or take the meds. I started taking meds on Monday the 8th. I contacted everyone, and informed them that I had Malaria and we will start a fresh, Lord willing 2026. I have been here for many years and during the last month of 2025 the wrong mosquito finally got me.

FBC members and neighbors brought in the New Year with a fellowship of games, food, testimonies, a devotion, lots of singing, and prayers. The meds worked and Malaria did not ruin the end of the year nor the start of 2026 for me. **To God Be The Glory!!!**
