Dear Family & Friends,

Thank you for all your prayers and support. I have a couple huge praises I want to share with you. One is for our Delta Cargo shipment that we sent out at the beginning of February. It passed through customs in less than a week! This was a huge answer to prayer as we have never had a shipment get released that quickly. Second, after traveling back and forth to Honduras for the past two years, I have officially moved to Honduras! This has been an answer to many prayers.

February was packed with team preparations, beginning my residency process, finding a house, and getting settled into full time ministry here in Honduras. Shortly after I arrived, we met with admins and directors from the local hospital. During this time we were able to finalize and sign an agreement between the hospital and the Rearick Surgical Center. This will allow us to continue working hand in hand in helping the people of El Progreso.

Rearick Team #1

At the very end of February, our first surgical team arrived. This team consisted of 11 team members who all, except one, had been here before which helped things go smoother. It is exciting seeing people fall in love with the ministry here and want to return. The week was filled with hard work, deep conversations, games, and lots of laughter. We are praising the Lord for the 15 general patients who not only received life changing surgeries, but were showed how they too could have eternal life. One patient started visiting church after his first consultation. Praying for each of these patients that the seeds that have been planted will grow, and that they will come to know the Lord.

Rearick Team # 2

On April 4th the second team of the year arrived. Of the 13 team members, ten had served together last September. It was encouraging to see them grow closer together, and include the other "new" team members. We were joined by Gina Gonzalez from El Salvador who filled one of our anesthesia provider needs. Gina's father is a pastor who MMO serves with in El Salvador. Gina and the other anesthesia providers took time to teach each other the difference in anesthesia medications and techniques they use at their workplaces. By the end of the week our team of two surgeons, general and gynecology, performed 32 surgeries.

During follow-up a patient stated the attention and care given to her was excellent. She was very nervous about having strangers operate, but was surprised at how high the level of care she received.

One patient had a very large inguinal hernia that was causing pain and discomfort. Dr. Cruz, with the assistance of Dr. Hernandez, was able to repair the hernia. Patient is doing well post surgery. He is able to walk and work without any pain.

Another patient had multiple little lipomas removed from her arm and legs. She said she felt like a new person after they were removed.



Last week I was able to start serving at the church's Libreria (bookshop) where snacks, books, and other items can be purchased after church. This has allowed me to meet new people and work more on my spanish. I have also been able to go out on evangelism on Saturday nights, and I still fill in and help out at Hope Children's Home when needed.

An exciting addition to serving at the Rearick is I will be cross training to be a team operations coordinator for our general clinic teams in Central America. This role is similar to what I do during our surgical teams. I will help with determining the set up and flow of the clinic, training triage and lab, and making sure the clinic is flowing smoothly. In June I will be serving in Cojutepeque, El Salvador and Santa Rita, Honduras. Looking forward to this new opportunity.
