at the airport. He always kindly entrusts me with his pulpit whenever I pass through Kuala Lumpur—for the entire Sunday services: the Chinese service, Sunday School, the English service, and the evening service. The members are always accommodating and warmly welcoming us.

Back in Ipoh, I thank the Lord that in my discipleship with Bro. EP, Sis. Pat, and Sis. Janice, I have seen fruit. I usually spend 3–5 hours answering their questions, and now they are faithful in all the services and even sing specials together with the other believers. They have also begun inviting their friends to church. I met Mr. Gerald, a Filipino

working in Malaysia, whom I have witnessed to, but who still struggles with his belief in spiritism and miracles. Please pray for his salvation. Pray also for Sis. Kim and Bro. Stephen, our regular visitors, hopefully they will become members of our church someday. The Martinez family—a long-time Filipino family friend from Thailand, now working in Penang—often visits and worships with us, even though it takes them two hours by train. Please also pray for Sis. Rachel, our only Malaysian member who remained faithful after the Covid pandemic, and has now transferred to Singapore for a new job.

Our ministry at the Rainbow Orphanage continues, where we have given the children various gifts—hair

accessories, stuffed toys, bags, and other game prizes. The orphanage managers are also praying for more financial support to sustain the children's needs and studies.

In Malaysia, freedom of religion is constitutionally guaranteed, but Muslims face legal restrictions when attempting to convert to Christianity. Civil courts protect the rights of non-Muslims, while Syariah courts control Muslim conversions and often deny requests. This creates a dual reality: conversion is straightforward for non-Muslims, but highly restricted for Muslims. For this reason, we are very careful in witnessing and even in distributing Gospel tracts. I have written seven kinds of Gospel tracts here—six in English and one in Tamil. For safety, we place the words 'For Non-Muslim' prominently on the front page of each tract. Some are handed out personally, while others are inserted on car door handles or in mailboxes."



During our exit to Singapore, I was invited to preach at Asia Grace Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Cajipe, before, during, and after their 10th World Missions Conference and Church Anniversary. The pulpit was entrusted to me five times. During the conference, I shared pulpit with Pastor Nable and Missionary Angeles. I was also given the privilege of bringing a message twice during their home Bible studies and fellowship.

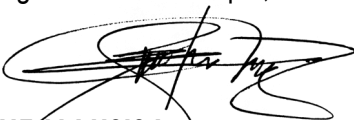
