The bright side to this new way is that it is economical, with no hosting, no motels, no travel expense, and no love offering required (but one would be much appreciated).

I'd love to minister to your people in person, but a Zoom meeting is probably not the best way, but it's better than nothing. We could do it at a Missions Conference on a Sunday or Wednesday prayer meeting night. I'm kind of like a first responder on 911: While everybody is trying to get out, he's trying to get in.
